# Role requirements

As a governor, you'll play a vital role in ensuring the school delivers the best possible education for all its pupils. You don't need to be an education expert – what matters most is your commitment to the school's success and your willingness to challenge and support the leadership team. The role includes providing a strategic overview for the school, acting as critical friend and ensuring accountability.

## What does the role involve?

- Attending governing board meetings (usually around six - eight per year)
- Visiting school (usually two – three times per year)
- Attending training to continually develop skills and knowledge
- Working with school leaders to set strategic direction
- Monitoring school performance and ensuring accountability
- Overseeing financial performance and ensuring money is well spent
- Ensuring statutory responsibilities are met, including safeguarding, health & safety and equalities


## What do you need to bring to the role?

- A passion for improving outcomes for children and young people
- Good communication and decision-making skills
- Willingness to learn and work as part of a team
- An ability to offer time and commitment to the role

- To listen to and respect the views of others
- To express held views clearly and succinctly
- To take on a fair share of work/positions of responsibility
